

Failure to Register with Selective Service Policy

Approved: June 14, 2019

Purpose: To inform Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Service Providers of the process they must undertake when a male individual seeking to participate in WIOA funded career and training services has failed to comply with Selective Service registration requirements.

Policy: A male individual who is 26 years of age or older, was born after December 31, 1959, did not register with Selective Service, and wishes to participate in WIOA career and training services, must request a Status Information Letter from Selective Service.

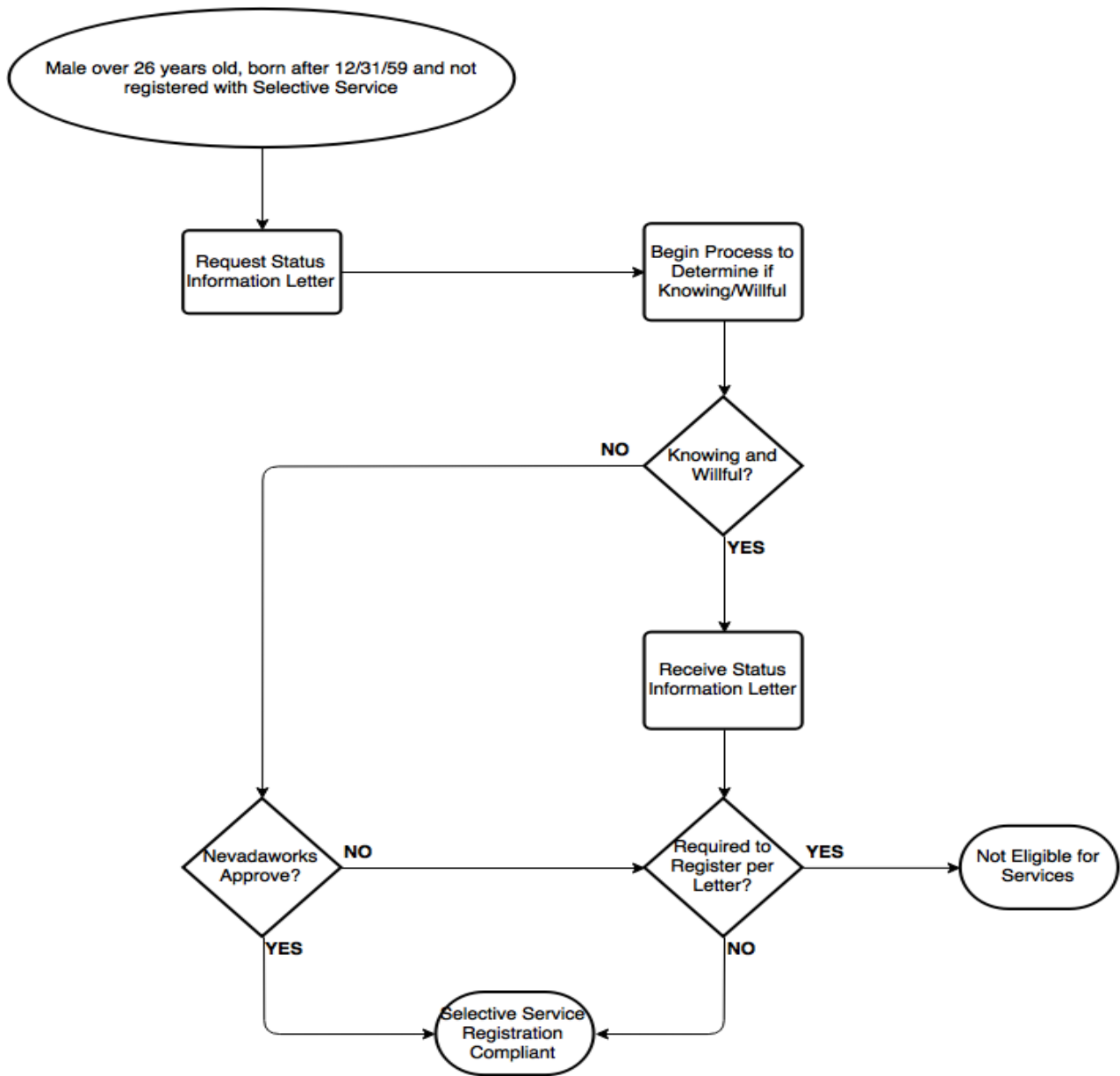
After the individual has requested the Status Information Letter from Selective Service, the Service Provider may begin the process of determining whether or not the individual's failure to register with Selective Service was knowing and willful. No WIOA funded activities and/or services may be provided to the individual during this determination period.

If the Status Information Letter indicates the individual was not required to register with Selective Service, the individual may be enrolled, and WIOA funded activities and/or services may be provided. A copy of the Status Information Letter must be placed in the participant's file.

If the Status Information Letter indicates the individual was required to register with Selective Service but did not do so and now cannot because he is 26 or older, the individual is presumed to be disqualified from WIOA funded activities and/or services until the Service Provider makes the determination that the individual's failure to register with Selective Service was not knowing and willful. No WIOA funded activities and/or services may be provided to the individual during this determination period.

If, after evaluating the evidence the individual provided, the Service Provider determines that the individual's failure to register with Selective Service was not knowing or willful, the individual may be eligible for WIOA funded activities and/or services. The Service Provider must contact Nevadaworks and provide an explanation for the conclusion that the individual's failure to register with Selective Service was not knowing and willful. Once Nevadaworks approves the Service Provider's conclusion, the individual may be enrolled and receive WIOA funded activities and/or services. Adequate notes must be entered into the Management Information System (MIS) for male participants who have been affected by this policy.

If, after evaluating the evidence provided by the individual, the Service Provider determines that the individual's failure to register with Selective Service was knowing and willful, then the individual may not be enrolled, and no WIOA funded activities and/or services can be provided. The Service Provider must document all phases of its investigation and decision.
