**Re: Income Guidelines — 2021 Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) and
Poverty Guidelines**

In accordance with the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, State Compliance Policy Section 1.7, DETR is issuing income guidelines effective April 9, 2021, to assist Local Workforce Development Board staff in determining eligibility for low-income individuals.

On February 1, 2021, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services published their poverty guidelines in the Federal Register Vol. 86, No. 19, which were applicable on January 13, 2021. On April 9, 2021, the most recent U.S. Department of Labor LLSIL figures were published in the Federal Register Vol. 86, No. 67 on April 9, 2021.
